HEWI has received two recent enquiries about our critically endangered plant species. The first was for a suitable photo to display at the forthcoming 11th Australasian Plant Conservation Conference, 14th - 18th November 2016 at the Royal Botanic Gardens Victoria, Melbourne

highlighting 12 'flagship' endangered species.

Then we had a request from BAW BAW shire - specimen/s had been found in Rokeby Flora and Fauna Reserve and Steve has been in contact with Council's Indigenous nursery re seed collection.

YARRA RANGES LOCALISED PLANNING STATEMENT EXHIBITION DRAFT

This draft strategic document is now available and community input will again be essential if we wish to retain our unique planning controls which have been guided by the Upper Yarra Valley and Dandenong Ranges Regional Strategy Plan since 1992.

Due to a Victorian Government directive, a new localised planning statement is required and there has been a long process involving strategic planners and a Community Reference Group whose members have had extensive experience of planning issues within our region to produce the final draft.

Unfortunately, Council has demonstrated a lack of respect for the CRG's integrity by passing a Motion to amend specific wording in the draft before it could be exhibited for community consultation.

You may have seen the media article by Kath Gannaway in Mountain Views Mail, July 19 edition, which refers to this amendment proposed by Cr Child so that 'support transition to sustainable forestry' now reads as if forestry practice is already sustainable! (p.13).

Our CRG representative and colleagues are deeply concerned that their long hours and commitment have been belittled by such interference before the public consultation period has even been declared. FORESTS UPDATE

A lot of work continues to be done in the background, with little to show for it, as yet.

The Premier's Forest Industry Taskforce was due to submit a Statement of Intent by the end of June but, despite many hours of intense work, it has not been completed and a scheduled hand-over meeting with the Premier has been postponed. Similarly, there has been no clear progress with the Leadbeater's Possum Recovery Plan, although the Threatened Species Commissioner, Gregory Andrews has advised that the drafting team will brief the Threatened Species Scientific Committee shortly.

Surveyors from WOTCH (Wildlife of the Central Highlands) are continuing to mark up great success in locating and recording colonies of Leadbeater's Possums, with three new sightings in the past few weeks confirming the importance of Toolangi as habitat for the species. The work of this dedicated group has contributed to the suspension of logging in at least one coupe. Long may it last!

A community committee has been nominated to manage the Toolangi Forest Discovery Centre. Once appointed by the Minister it will commence work towards re-opening the TFDC after 4 years without use.

WATERWAYS PROTECTION

Environment Vic have recently launched "Aquaprint: A community vision for water reform in Victoria" and Yarra Riverkeepers have launched "The Future of the Yarra: Proposals for the Yarra River Protection Act". HEWI is an associate of both groups and we will be submitting comments to the latter in relation to the Upper Yarra region. Any comments most welcome.

Our first Grace Burn Project annual report is being compiled and will demonstrate that we are ahead of our own projections for this first year, mainly thanks to our facilitator Karen Garth and her liaison skills with community and multiple authorities.
