REPORTS:**Water Watch Volunteer Appreciation Day**

(One of the benefits of becoming a Water Watch volunteer!)

Following a moving smoking ceremony by Wurundjeri elders, Uncle Tony and his son Thane, we walked along the bush tracks around the Bollin Bollin Billabongs in Bulleen to discuss the Melbourne Water project that uses environmental water flows to restore water in the billabongs to stimulated eel and fish populations.

After our catered lunch, there was a presentation on current research that will lead to future eDNA testing, a far more comprehensive method of water testing than our current instruments can provide.

We also heard from other volunteer Water Watch groups from Lancefield to Mornington and suburban areas such as Blackburn Lake and Scotchman's Creek. These groups have approached water quality and catchment monitoring in action-oriented ways and as a result have identified problems that councils have been able to rectify by upgrading sewer systems and litter traps.

We have a copy of the detailed Manningham Waterways Health Report and will approach Yarra Ranges Council re a similar compilation across our region.

Meeting with Tammi Rose, Yarra Ranges CEO

This opportunity arose from our letter regarding the lack of environmental community engagement meetings as feeder sessions for members of the Yarra Ranges Environmental Advisory Committee (who do not represent specific groups). Following her reply, Cr McAllister invited Tammi to meet with your committee to further discuss our issues. We also took the opportunity to highlight attainments such as our research work on Pomaderris vacciniifolia, Round-leaf Pomaderris which was finally declared critically endangered under the EPBC Act, the official VICNAMES registration of Wirrup Yaluk and our staying power to achieve these. Members also presented on the local deer impact, our concerns re the new Yellingbo Conservation Area committee (DELWP) and the Great Forest National Park. We are most grateful for this open presentation on your behalf.

Litter Trackers

Our Grace Burn Facilitator, Karen Garth, attended this RMIT/Scotch College event in late July, where several bottles containing trackers and return messages were released into the Watts River. Through this, we hope to maintain contact with the Chum Creek campus of Scotch College and follow this project and the information it will provide.
