Deep Time Dreaming - Uncovering Ancient Australia

This seminar charts the revolution in Australia's timescale over the past halfcentury. Historian Billy Griffiths is the author of Deep Time Dreaming: Uncovering Ancient Australia and follows the activities of some of Australia's pioneering archaeologists. He investigates what it means to live in a place of great antiquity, with its complex questions of ownership and belonging.

Bats - fascinating creatures of the night Lindy is internationally recognised as an expert on the ecology and conservation of insectivorous bats. On the night following the seminar we will take a riverside walk with ultrasonic eavesdropping equipment to 'see' how many species can be detected. Sugar Gliders were found nesting in a decaying stump on the Grace Burn within the RSL property two years ago, when disturbed by a planting session with Healesville High School students. Last Wednesday evening, Karen checked out the stump, and two Sugar Gliders emerged at 8.35 pm! The stump is in danger of falling into the creek, but we hope to work with the RSL to place a nest box in the large trees nearby so that they have a less precarious nest site until the planted saplings provide natural habitat again in the future.

25 Years Of Waterwatch!

Minister Neville recently congratulated Waterwatch volunteers across Victoria who put in countless hours of their own time to support the health of our environment and waterways. The Melbourne Water Waterbug Census program has been running since 2014 and has had over 4,000 people involved in events, training and the collection of over 190 data samples. That's included identifying and counting around 20,000 macroinvertebrates!
