We hope all members are adapting to the cold weather- some of us are very pleased to have full water tanks. As you can see from our list of events, there's a lot happening in our area over the next few months of interest to members.

Council Grants

The committee has been successful in receiving another four year YRC Community Partnerships grant from July 2023 until June 2027. This grant will be for \$6000 per year. As well as delivering activities in the Ryrie Ward, we will be extending our educational activities into the O'Shannassy Ward in conjunction with local community groups there whose aims align with ours. We will deliver our final activity for our current grant by 20 June, which is the day of our planting morning with Healesville Primary School, Melbourne Water, the Yarra Ranges Council Bushland Team and Cummins Filtration. We will celebrate 10 years of Cummins helping us care for our local waterways.

Healesville Home Grown Food Fair

We had a stall at this event on a Sunday 2 April, and Karen lead a nature walk around Coronation Park discussing the revegetation and platypus. Many thanks to Bob for coming to help set up and stay for most of the morning, and Bronwyn for being at the stall while the walk was on, and helping take down. We had 30 visitors, and handed out information about us, HCoRE and weed and native plant brochures.

Autumn Waterbugs

We welcome new volunteers to help us survey the invertebrates in the Grace Burn on Friday 28 April. Sampling usually commences at 8.30 am and if we have enough volunteers, we do two sites. Samples are taken to the Art Room of the HLLC for analysis and uploading to Melbourne Water. Free morning tea and training provided.

21st Anniversary Planting Sunday 28 May

Another great milestone that we will be celebrating is the 21st Anniversary Planting at Coronation Park with the Lions Club, Melbourne Water and Yarra Ranges Council. We hope that all of the groups who have planted in the park join us to visit their sites, and that they and community members plant the new site by River St. RSVP required for catering, and members are needed to help with our display and morning tea.

New Safe Child Standards

In order to maintain our duty of care to our young volunteers and activity participants, we must abide by the new standards, which came into effect on 1 July 2022. Our Rules

Over the past year we have had a sub-committee looking at our current 2006 Rules and comparing them to the 2012 Model Rules for Associations. At our April meeting the committee agreed to recommend to members that we replace our 2006 Rules with the 2012 Model Rules, so that we act according to best practice. All members will receive a detailed email soon about this, and be given until the May meeting to ask questions and indicate if they are in favour. Once this feedback has been received, a Special Meeting will be convened via Zoom. Proxy voting will be permitted.

Objection to Badgers Brook application

We have submitted a detailed objection to the application YR 2022/562 by Badgers Brook Winery for a retrospective permit for the erection of playground structures, one marquee and increase to the playground area.
