# Bunnings Petition – from Environment East Gippsland

"Bunnings sells wood from the ash forests of the Central Highlands – which are listed as Critically Endangered on the **IUCN list** of endangered ecosystems. It's also the habitat of the Critically Endangered Leadbeaters Possum. Yet it claims it only sells ethical, legal and sustainable timber. ## 27th AGM

Following a detailed annual report by our committee and our Grace Burn Project facilitator (on HEWI website), we were delightfully entertained with a presentation by Evelyn Feller on their experiences living in British Columbia. Evelyn showed stunning photos of the mountains, rivers and oceans, in which they walked, skied, climbed and kayaked, but she also reflected on the changes taking place due to development and increased tourism. Evelyn and Michael have been heavily involved with many environmental issues and have been responsible for some protective measures being implemented. They remain involved with several of those issues, even though they are also supporting local ones now as well.

# **Platypus and River Health**

HEWI has been invited to participate in two film clips to promote Platypus awareness and protection of our waterways.
