EUROPEAN WASP CONTROL

October is the time to catch the QUEEN wasp before she makes a nest using a simple environmentally friendly method. Thanks to Laurie Nicoll for this proven recipe.

Method: Drill a 1.25 litre soft drink bottle with 3 holes approximately 10mm in diameter and about 100 - 150mm from the bottom of the bottle. Use a bait made from honey, water and a little pure vanilla essence (which has alcohol in it) this ferments in the sun. Make up a solution of 4-5 tablespoons of honey in hot water with a little pure vanilla essence. This will do 4-5 traps. The bait will take a couple of days to activate. Divide the bait between traps, top up with water to just below holes, replace cap and hang in a sunny spot in the garden - Fruit trees with curly leaf is a good place. Shake every few days to let bait dribble out. Keep in place until January. Strain out when full, reuse and top up bait with water.

Register of Environmental Organisations

"The Committee is inquiring into the administration, transparency and effectiveness of the Register of Environmental Organisations under the *Income Tax Assessment Act 1997"*.

Steve presented a detailed rebuttal of the false and unsubstantiated claims made by Mr Mark Poynter the previous day, and so all the historical records and scientifically verified facts will now be on the public record for all time.

My thanks for your feedback to recent newsletters, which last month included my parochial exaggeration implying loss of Mountain Ash as a global species. Hopefully, the mighty 'regnans' will continue to survive in Tasmania and even – perhaps – in very small pockets here in south eastern Victoria. However, the fact is that only 1% of our Mountain Ash forests are now unlogged and unburned compared to at least 30% in the pre-European era. This limited area of old-growth and the lack of recruitment of hollow-bearing trees contributed to the published assessment under IUCN criteria that the Mountain Ash ecosystem of our Central Highlands is critically endangered. Hence the urgency for our Great Forest National Park! MB.
