## YARRA RIVER PROTECTION (WILLIP-GIN BIRRARUNG MURRON) ACT 2017

The Birrarung Council was created to advise the Victorian Government on key priorities under the Water for Victoria plan and the Yarra River Protection Act 2017. The appointments include two Yarra Riverkeeper members and Wurundjeri Traditional Owners.

HEWI has been involved with this process and is now invited to a Community Roundtable with Environmental Justice Australia, Yarra Riverkeepers and others to work on the Yarra Strategic Plan. This is a required commitment for Melbourne Water so much depends on the content, rigour and ambition of that Plan.

Unfortunately, both HEWI delegates to this process are unavailable for this initial meeting, so if any other HEWI member could attend, please contact Maureen **asap**. The details are: **10am – 4pm, Saturday 13 October 2018 Heidelberg**. There will be a briefing paper and work sheet beforehand to inform participants and to structure preliminary thinking from each group. This information would then be circulated prior to the Roundtable and provide a basis for discussions. A sitting fee is offered for regional delegates.
