## CLEARFELLING THE FUTURE.... VICTORIA'S ENDANGERED FORESTS

You may be aware that the Victorian government has instigated a process to decide the fate of our remaining areas of tall forest, both in the Central Highland and East Gippsland regions. By the end of the year it will make a decision either to allow clear-fell logging to continue until the remaining forest resources are completely logged out within 10 years, or to protect the forest that is left by declaring new reserves and National Parks, with exit packages for affected workers and companies.

The Environmental Media Foundation is producing a series of four short documentaries called, *Clear-felling The Future*. These will expose the environmental damage being done to Victoria's native forests by clear-fell logging, and the social and economic cost to our community. These films will be produced quickly and help to educate the public about logging issues and help bring about a better conservation outcome for our forests.

We hope to be able to bring these films to Healesville soon.

## **GRACE BURN PROJECT REPORT**

Our first annual review noted that we had exceeded our target and were under-budget, a very pleasing position for the start of Year 2 of our 3 years' program. We are deeply indebted to our facilitator, Karen Garth for her successful contacts with residents along the Grace Burn, many of whom have joined Melbourne Water's Streamside Management Plans. Amongst these is the Healesville R.S.L., and their extensive frontage was planted by contractors last week. R.S.L. members are to be congratulated on their decision to double the number of plants initially provided through the grant which will ensure that the Healesville township.

### **FUEL REDUCTION BURNING**

HEWI members have long been involved in this controversial process through many forums and discussions with DELWP and consequent submissions. We continue to follow the latest research and proposals and met with regional DELWP staff last week.

DELWP and Parks Victoria are hosting a series of information sessions to help answer questions about strategic fuel management planning and to seek feedback on the proposed changes to the Fire Management Zones in your area.

### **MAJOR PLANNING AMENDMENTS**

Yarra Ranges Council has undertaken a major strategic revision of the planning policies that were derived from the original Regional Strategy Plan(RSP), Of special note is a new Environmental Significance Overlay and related vegetation controls (with loss of others) and new policy for dwellings in green wedge areas. Whilst these changes are designed to protect our biolinks along waterways, it will be essential to ensure controls over other remnant bushland areas are maintained.

There are two Amendments, C148 and Amendment 122 to cover the changes required in the RSP to ensure consistency with the new Planning Scheme. Obviously this is a complicated process and the HEWI committee has been studying the documents for some time. However, we urge you to attend one of the public meetings just announced and ask your questions and record your comments.

This November the beautiful Mountain Ash forests of Toolangi will provide the backdrop and inspiration for Toolangi Sculpture Trail 2016, to celebrate the 20th Anniversary of the International Sculpture Event UNESCO, 1996. The original trail endures and from 6-20 November it will become a hub of artistic and environmental activity. This residency of 15 Victorian artists will create permanent or ephemeral work that will form a second stage in the creative story of this landscape working with natural materials sourced mostly from the surrounding Toolangi State Forest.
